The Rosewood Traveling Exhibition will open with a wine and cheese reception Monday as part of Black History Month lectures at the Spady Cultural Heritage Museum.

Janie Bradley Black, a descendant of a Rosewood family, will speak about the 1923 massacre from 5 to 7 p.m. at the museum, 170 NW Fifth Ave.

Black and Sherry DuPree, exhibit curator, will discuss the effects of the town's decimation on the state. Black is a historian and a member of the Rosewood Heritage Foundation. DuPree is a professor at Santa Fe Community College in Gainesville.

The exhibit, featuring 12 panels of photographs and text, was created at the 75th anniversary of the slayings to commemorate the history and culture of life in Rosewood. The lecture is free for Spady members, \$6 for others. To reserve a spot, call 561-279-8883.
